Hubert Faustmann is Professor of History and International Relations at the University of Nicosia, where he has worked since 1999. Additionally, he is the director of the Friedrich-Ebert-Stiftung Cyprus office since May 2011. In this capacity he leads a small team which organizes and coorganises seminars, workshops and supervises expert reports on various aspects of Cypriot History and Politics..

He was the editor in Chief of the refereed journal The Cyprus Review from 2006 until 2016. He co-writes with Prof. Ahmet Sozen the annual reports about Cyprus for the Political Data Yearbook of the European Journal of Political Research. He is also editor and one of the authors of the bimonthly FES Cyprus Newsletter, which covers political, social, labour and economic developments on both sides of the divide. Professor Faustmann is an expert on British colonial Cyprus and post-independence Cypriot history and politics including contemporary Cyprus. His research also focuses on the Politics in the Eastern Mediterranean with a special emphasis on Hydrocarbon politics.

He is the author of Divide and Quit? British Colonial Policy in Cyprus 1878-1960, (MATEO (EBook), 1999) and is the editor/co-editor of several volumes, including: The Period of the EOKA Struggle 1955-1959 (Bloomsbury, forthcoming in 2026); Cyprus in the First World War (Bloomsbury. 2025); When the Cemetery Becomes Political, Dealing with the Religious Heritage in Multi-Ethnic Regions (Münster/New York, Waxmann, 2020); The Role of Education in Multicultural Cyprus (Cambridge Scholars Publishing, 2017); An Island in Europe: The EU and the Transformation of Cyprus (I.B. Tauris, 2009); The Government and Politics of Cyprus, (Peter Lang, 2008); Britain in Cyprus: Colonialism and Post-Colonialism 1878-2006, (Bibliopolis, 2006). He has published numerous book chapters and peer-reviewed articles.
